Hello cousins!

I hope you all have had a wonderful year and are making your plans to attend the 152nd Annual Reunion of the descendants of William and Sarah Wells Bull on Aug. 3, 2019. Our Annual Reunion and Picnic is the <u>second oldest</u>, <u>continuous annual</u> <u>family reunion in the country</u>! Not too many people in America can say that they are part of a such an incredible legacy, something we can't take for granted.

I would like to share a recent example of preserving the legacy of the Bull family. A descendant, Penelope Ann Bull Clary, of Sarasota Florida, sent two family bibles for preservation in the Bull archives at the Homestead in Campbell Hall, NY. These bibles date back to the early 1800's, over 200 years old. One bible was Henry James Walshes' grandfather of one of the early Bull genealogists St



Walshs', grandfather of one of the early Bull genealogists Stevenson Walsh, and the other was from Penelope's father Richard Leonard Bull. Penelope's words regarding the Bible donation "I'm doing this for my Father; the Stone House is where these bibles belong." We are so honored to receive these important family legacy items, with hand written ancestor records inscribed throughout, Thank you Penelope for contributing these items to our collections at the Homestead. We truly play an important role preserving our part of the nation's history.



 Take Rt. 207 through Goshen to a right (East) on Sarah Wells Trail. Go about four miles to a right on County Rt 51, then an immediate right on the gravel lane alongside Hamptonburgh Cemetery.

Traveling from North or South:

1. Take I-87 to the Harriman exit. Then take Rt. 17 West to exit #124 - Rt. 207 towards Goshen. Follow #2 above

Looking ahead to building improvements in 2019.

Over the past two years your board has been pursuing improvements to the Stone House on many fronts: electrical safety, mold remediation, and identifying necessary masonry and carpentry repairs in the Basement level. We are in the process of soliciting bids for the replacement of the family room and kitchen windows, for related masonry and waterproofing repairs, and for new finish carpentry and plaster work to restore the family room and kitchen. We will also be pursuing new ventilation systems in the basement to assure combustion air for the boiler, and assure the movement of fresh air through the basement. These projects will be undertaken after the picnic, and will be ready for the arrival of our new caretaker.
